January Business Meeting Minutes

Skyview Radio Society Monthly Business Meeting – March 1, 2022

Call to Order: 7:30 PM by President Scott Gliebe, AC3GB.

Attending – 23 members: N3MWC, W3BUW, N3TIN, K3JAS, AG3U, KC3PXQ, W3IU, NJ3R, K3STL, WA3HGW, NM3A, K3FAZ, N2MA, AB3GY, AJ3O, AG3I, WA3KFS, K3JZD, AC3GB, KB3EYY, WA3LCY, W3ZVX, WC3O.

Prior Meeting Minutes: The minutes of the February 1, 2022 meeting were distributed at the meeting for member review. A motion to accept the minutes as presented was made by N3WMC and seconded by AB3GY. The motion passed without objection.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Jody, K3JZD, passed out the financial report as of 28 February 2022, copy attached. Fixed expenses are in good shape, forecasting a surplus at the present rate for expenses. There was additional income from donations, 50/50 drawing, club banquet, etc. A motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented was made by W3JAS and seconded by NM3A. The motion passed without objection.

Membership Report: Tom, AB3GY, indicated there are no new membership applications outstanding. Membership now stands at 135, including silent keys KA3HPM and KB3KHR. There are 20 inactive members who have not renewed for 2022. A motion to accept the Membership Report as presented was made by AJ3O and seconded by KA3PXQ. The motion passed without objection.

Radio Officer Report: All radios and equipment are working well at this time. The replacement 10 meter vertical is ready to install on the repeater tower. We are awaiting suitable weather for the tall tower work. The donated Elecraft K2 transceiver works well. It will be used to make a "POTA Pack" geared toward getting new operators on the air. We received the parts to repair the AL-1500 amplifier. We just need time to get them installed and tested. The receive loop antenna is back up after being broken, probably by a deer.

Kitchen Report: The kitchen fund balance is \$58. Kitchen supplies are good. Note a new price list is posted on the refrigerator. Bob, WC3O, noticed at his last kitchen buy that food prices are going up. The prices had not been revised for several years, and by now the kitchen was running at a loss.

VE Report: The next VE session is March 19. The February session had two applicants, resulting in a new Technician and an upgrade to General. The May VE exams will be moved to the 2nd Saturday since the Dayton Hamvention is on the 3rd Saturday. Bill, W3BUW, received the list of all new licensees from the last year. He will be sending out a questionnaire to see how many have been active and what we can do to help them.

Newsletter: The Feb issue of the *Q5er* is out. Jody is looking for newsletter submissions by March 15 for the April issue.

Facilities: We are waiting for the weather to break to fix some electrical issues in the attic and to paint trees around the perimeter of the grounds with purple paint to indicate No Hunting and No Trespassing per the new state law. This is in addition to the existing No Hunting and No Trespassing signs posted.

Building Committee: There is a meeting scheduled for Wednesday March 2 with Mike Williams of MW Construction for final pricing and a written contract.

Old Business: Regarding ARRL Operating Manuals for donating to local libraries, K3FAZ is working with Joe, W3BC, to see if the club can get any discount or promotional cost reduction.

We are still working on setting up CPR classes.

New Business: Nothing pending at this time.

Elmer Night: The March Elmer Night will be the presentation which was delayed from February on EME (Earth-Moon-Earth) or "Moonbounce" presented by Wayne, K3WM. Bob, WC3O, offered a slide show of past Dayton Hamventions. This can be a preview for first time attendees and also an incentive to get hams to go for the first time.

Net Report: February net check-ins are 38, 40, 34 and 38 for an average of 37.5.

50/50 Drawing: The total collected was \$37. The winner of \$18.50 was Jody, K3JZD. Jody donated the proceeds to the club treasury.

Meeting Adjourned: A motion to adjourn was made by WA3KFS and seconded by WA3LCY. The motion passed without objection. The meeting was adjourned at 8:04 PM.

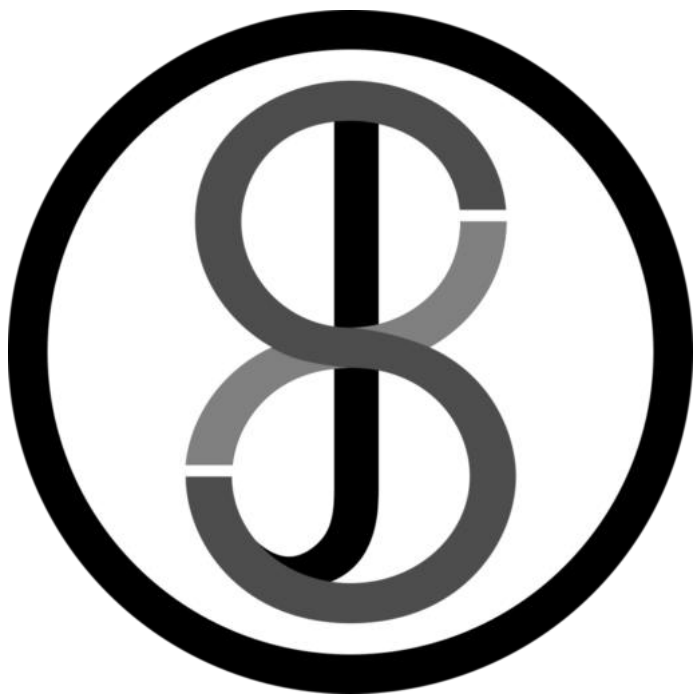

Wayne put on a great show, Solving mechanical & electrical challenges, Years of design, in the final hours of the EME contest. Looking around the shack, A feed horn for one of the bands, preamps, exciters, all designed and built over several year. In attendance Jack K3JAS, Steve K3FAZ, Marty AG3I, Cooky, WC3O & AI N2MA



If you have ever tried to send Winlink emails in the field, you know that isn't always the easiest program to use. When it works it is a joy, but when the available gateways are clogged or propagation is down, it can be a real nightmare.

Enter JS8Call (or what used to be called FT8Call). JS8Call uses the same algorithms as FT8 for weak-signal communications, so propagation challenges are minimized. The great thing about JS8Call for EMCOMM in the field is that you can easily create APRS-IS messages that can be routed through to various communication modalities.

I have successfully (and easily) sent emails, text messages, and eight- and ten-digit grid position reports using three very easy APRS-IS commands in JS8CALL—something FT8 is just not designed to do. Here are the three JS8Call syntaxes for emails, texts, and grid position reports:

Format for SMS Text:

@APRSIS<SP>CMD<SP>:SMSGTE<SP><SP><SP>:@1
#####<SP>Message

Format for Email:

@APRSIS<SP>CMD<SP>:EMAIL-
2<SP><SP>:youremail@giggle.com<SP>: Message

Format for APRS Messages:

@APRSIS<SP>GRID

There is a small program available to format the above messages which you can [download here](#). Thank you to Billy Penley, KN4MKB, of [The Modern Ham](#) for writing this awesome program.

Finally, for you Android users there is a free app that will use your device's GPS to calculate your ten-digit grid zone. It is called HamGPS and can be found on Google's Play Store. Put the grid zone in the set up for JS8Call to give your correct position report.

Where to begin where to begin?

This article and the articles to follow in future newsletters are about N1MM+ contest logging software.

Logging software: Everyone uses logging software. Well, almost everyone. There are basically two different kinds of logging software. You have your everyday radio operating logging software, then you have contest logging software. They both log contacts – But if you want to operate contests, and be successful you will want good contest logging software. There are many important tools built in that will greatly increase your score. Trust me.

I will talk to you from my point of view. I was first licensed as a Novice back in 1979. I was a ham for many years and I never even remotely thought about contesting. Why? Mainly because I didn't have any contest elmers. I listened on the bands on contest weekends and heard the repetitious calls of CQ and the repetitious exchanges. It all seemed kinda silly and stupid to me. I didn't have anyone to tell me what contesting is really all about.

As it turns out, it has many facets. It wasn't until I started coming up to Skyview that I got to see why this activity was quite fun, interesting and challenging. My contesting elmers at the club where some first-rate operators. This includes George, N3GJ, Doc, K3MD and Rich, K3RWN. I would quietly sit be-

hind them and watch them operate. I would marvel at the efficiency of their operating. Each of them have a different style. I'd take something from each and merge them to make my own style.

One time years ago (I think it was the PA QSO Party) I was running a frequency on phone. One of the critical elements that you monitor is your "rate" (Your QSOs per hour). I was running something like 50 "Qs" an hour. George, N3GJ was watching behind me. George asked if I needed a break and he would side into the chair. I said sure. Geo sat down and I watch the rate meter go from @ 50 to @ 150! Same radio. Same antenna. Same frequency. Clearly I had room for improvement!

I can tell you all that I now know about contesting I learned simply by watching others operate who knew what they were doing. As I stated prior, everyone has their own operating style. I take a little this, I take little that, and make my own style of operating. You do what works for YOU.

The truth meter is the rate meter in your "contest logging software". There is actually MUCH more to being a good contester than simply your Q rate capability. Much more. I can only imagine George sitting behind me watching my 50 Qs per hour rate thinking – Come on come on! He never said a word. Every contester started out at the bottom of the heap. Even George.

It was Rich, K3RWN that got Skyview involved with RTTY contesting. Again, in the beginning, I thought it was a really dumb idea. I was wrong. At the time I was thinking of using N3FJP logging software at the club. It is good solid logging software. Scott, N3FJP provides for many of the popular contests in the contest versions of his software.

Rich insisted that we use a contest logging software called WriteLog. I never heard of it. I thought, what's the difference – It's just logging software? I quickly found out the difference. I have great re-

spect for Scott, N3FJP and his software. I have used it for years and still use it as my everyday logging software. It's great. But, in my opinion, it doesn't hold a candle to good contest logging software. Sorry OM Scott. I do love your software, however.

When it comes to good contest logging software you basically have three choices.

N1MM <https://n1mmwp.hamdocs.com/> (THE most popular)

WriteLog <https://writelog.com/>

WinTest <http://www.win-test.com/>

Everyone has their favorite and for good reasons, for them. Sometimes it is just what you grew up with. You pay a small amount for WriteLog and WinTest. The cost is VERY reasonable. All three are great contest logging software packages.

Rich, K3RWN and Mike, K3FH prefer WriteLog. Tim, K3LR swears by WinTest. Me? I like them all but prefer N1MM. NOT because it's FREE. Because I find it most intuitive to use. I have found N1MM to be very stable. The last thing you want is software problems in the middle of a contest!

The reason I decided to change the Skyview standard from WriteLog to N1MM was because (at the time) I was having a persistent problem with WriteLog being unstable. Often we would need to reboot in the middle of a contest. Other times it would intermittently loose communications with the radio.

That was long ago and I'm sure WriteLog is stable now. At the time it was really frustrating me. I decided to switch to N1MM and I've never looked back. N1MM is written and maintained not by a single person, but a TEAM of very high-power software developers. It is constantly being tweaked and improved. New and important features are being written and added all of the time. I really don't know how the developers do it, but my hat is

off to them. Amazing. Also, the fact that it FREE allows YOU to experiment with N1MM at no risk whatsoever.

Contest logging software looks and operates differently than everyday logging software. There are numerous “windows” that you can have open, or keep closed. What windows you want open or left closed depends on the particular contest and your preferences.

The logging software can occupy part of one screen or consume three large screens. I’ll explain more in future articles. I’ll start out next time talking about the basic logging window in N1MM. It’s small but very powerful. This is where you’ll set up your personal data, radio communications, log management, digital interfacing and more.

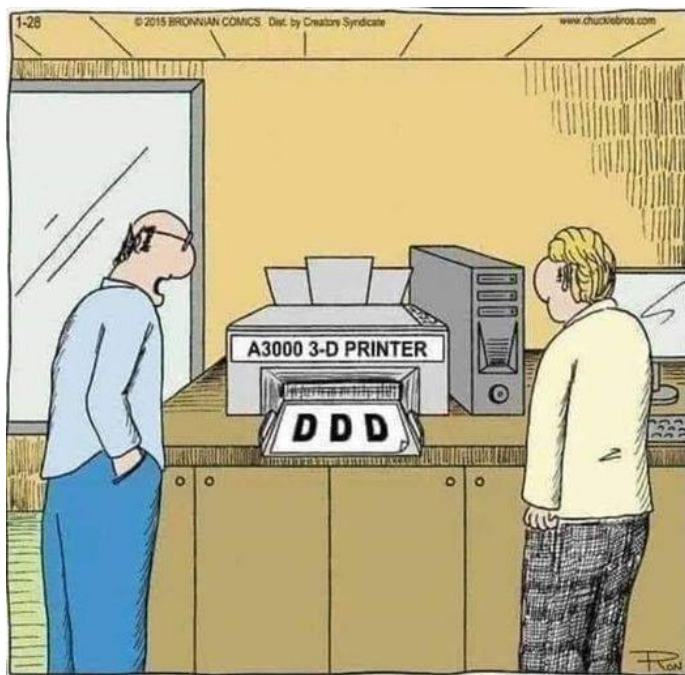
